Füchse meet Velenje, Hamburg face Skjern

EHF Cup Finals hosts Füchse Berlin will play against Gorenje Velenje in the semi-final, while 2013 VELUX EHF Champions League winners HSV Hamburg will take on Skjern Handbold after the draw at the Max-Schmeling-Halle defined both pairings of the Men's EHF Cup's season-ending tournament on Tuesday.



The EHF Cup Finals will be played in Berlin on 16 and 17 May 2015 with semi-finals to be played on Saturday, the match for third place and the final on Sunday.

Playing times announced

On the fringes of the draw event the playing times for all four matches have been also announced. The first semi-final will throw off at 14:30 hrs local time followed by the second semi-final at 17:30. The order of the matches will be confirmed in the upcoming days following consultations with TV partners. The match for third place will begin at 14:30 hrs local time on Sunday and the final will take place at 17:30 hrs.

EHF Cup Finals live on Sky Deutschland

German broadcaster Sky Deutschland has confirmed that it is to broadcast the final weekend of the Men's EHF Cup live and exclusively in its German-speaking markets. Sky will be reporting live from the Max-Schmeling-Halle in Berlin and showing all four matches live.

Matches of Skjern will be shown live by TV3 Sport in Denmark and matches of Velenje by Sportklub in Slovenia.

About the Men's EHF Cup

The new Men's EHF Cup was formed at the beginning of the 2012/13 season following the merging of the Men's EHF Cup and the Men's Cup Winners' Cup. The competition forms the second tier of competition after the VELUX EHF Champions League and above the Men's Challenge Cup. The new competition also brought with it a new format, with three qualification rounds, a Group Phase, Quarter-finals and a final tournament – the EHF Cup Finals.

About the EHF Cup Finals in Berlin

The event will be held in the Max-Schmeling-Halle in Berlin, with the capacity of up to 10,000 spectators, over two days with semi-finals to be played on Saturday, 16 May, the match for third/fourth place and the final on Sunday, 17 May. More than 100 volunteers, 150 media representatives, 20,000 spectators, and up to 80 players will take part in the two-day tournament.
